LCI's Year Round Growth Program classifies Lions clubs the world over into 3 categories -

- Clubs with 21 or fewer members
- Clubs with 22 to 40 members; and
- Clubs with 41 or more members

Sydney Chinese Lions currently has 60 members and belongs to the 41+ members category. For a club in this category to be awarded the honour, it has to have a positive net membership growth in a given Lions Year with a minimum of 8 new members joining the club.

As a result of the marvelous team work and recruitment efforts of its members, in the 2007-8 Lions year, the club managed to attain this very important goal. See below for the award patch that the club recently received.

What is fascinating is that this is the fourth year in a row that Sydney Chinese Lions has been presented with this award. In the three preceding Lions years, ie, the 2004-5, 2005-6, 2006-7 Lions Years, under the leadership of their long serving President Dr Anthony Cheung, the club managed



to attain LCI's Year Round Membership Growth goals year after year. They are proud to be recipients of this award for the fourth consecutive year.




