Charity Ball 2008 Tidbits

A \$15,000 Prize offered by the Chief of Army

Lieutenant General Peter Leahy AC, Chief of Army and Mrs Lee Leahy graced our Charity Ball 2008 on 1 March as Guests of Honour. They didn't come empty handed. Indeed, the General kindly offered a very rare prize for us to auction off - a package for 4 people to spend a day at the Holsworthy Army Camp with the commandos of the 4th Battalion, complete with a ride on a Black Hawk helicopter above and around Sydney. It was the third time in Australian history that a prize like this was offered. Bidding for the prize was passionate. Within seconds, it went from \$2,000 to \$3,000, then \$4,000 and \$5,000. Auctioneer Michael Photios then invited General Leahy to go up stage for a brief interview re: the Army and the prize. No sooner after the interview, the bidding shot on from \$5,500 to over \$10,000. Eventually, the prize went under the hammer for a hefty \$15,000, compliments of our long time supporter - Dr. A. Nicolaou - rather fittingly, a guest invited along by Lion Howard Shi, our own Tail Twister.

Our 1st **International President Al Brandel** attended the Lions Conference in Tasmania. It was here that he was moved by the guest speaker Fr Chris Riley who spoke of his **Youth off the Streets** program. Due to the interaction VP Al secured a \$12,000 donation towards the program. There are over 68,000 homeless people under the age of 17 in Australia today and this donation was accepted by Fr Chris at the last Council meeting in February. Tasmanian **DG Leigh Jones** presented Fr Chris with a MJF from District T1.

Dean & I were again invited to attend the **Sydney Chinese Charity Ball** on 1st March and with 300 people in attendance it is easy to see how their total income on the night

was in excess of \$70,000. The night profit was donated to the **Royal Flying Doctor. Chief of Army, Lieutenant General Peter Leahy** also attended and
