SYDNEY CHINESE LIONS AT LIONS DISTRICT 201 N5 CONVENTION IN LITHGOW



From Friday, 16 to Sunday, 18 November 2012. District 201 N5 of Lions Club International held their Annual Convention in Lithgow. The Convention was an official gathering of Delegates of Lions Clubs in the District. Each Club is entitled to one Delegate for every ten members on its roll. The Convention was chaired Lion District by Governor Greg Dunn and hosted by the Lions Club of Crestwood at the recently refurbished Civic Ballroom at the Tony Luchetti Showground in Lithgow.

The Opening Ceremony was on Friday evening and the Convention concluded after lunch on Sunday. During that time, Lions debated many matters of importance, including projects to be supported and amendments to sections of the Constitution. The theme for the Formal Dinner on Saturday night was Over and Black". 200 Conventioneers attended the Convention with many accommodation providers reporting solid bookings for the weekend.

Special Guests at the Convention were Lion Wayne Madden, International President of Lions Clubs International and his wife Lion Linda from Auburn, Indiana, USA. This was their first ever trip to the west of the mountains in Sydney.

There were two key note speakers. The first was Mr Richard Appleby, Chief Executive Officer of Can Assist. He spoke about the importance of supporting the funding for cancer patients from rural Australia in order for them to receive suitable treatment in metropolitan areas. The second was Mr Graeme Hosken from the Dubbo School of Distance Education who spoke about the education services they offer.

The Business Sessions of the Convention otherwise passed various motions regarding (a) Can Assist Building Appeal;

(b) Amendment to sections of the District Constitution and (c) Lions reading action program.

Then it came what was to me the highlight of the Convention - the nomination and election of District Governor, 1st Vice District Governor and 2nd Vice District Governor for 2013-14. Lion Warren Latham, the only candidate for DG and our own Lion Dr Anthony Cheung, the only candidate for 1st Vice DG easily won the hearts of the Convention and the vote of confidence with their passionate speeches. There were two nominations for 2nd Vice DG; including Lion Dennis Halpin and Lion Joanne Sim who both gave inspiring speeches. There were 2 nominations for the 3 available positions of the 3-Year Directorships of the Lions Nurses Scholarship Foundation Board, including Lion Michael Butler and our own Lion May Wong and they were elected automatically. The third position was opened to the floor, for which there were two contenders - Lion Cate Turner from Sydney Host and Lion Cheryl Buffett from Norfolk Island. The voting was conducted in earnest after the Similar to previous N5 speeches. Conventions, the results were held in suspense until the following morning. Then it was announced that the 2nd Vice DG went to Lion Joanne Sim and the third Director's position of the Lions Nurses Scholarship Foundation Board went to Lion Cheryl Buffet.

This convention saw Sydney Chinese Lions deeply involved in the three following areas:

- (1) Lion Dr Anthony Cheung's successful election as First Vice District Governor of N5 (2013-14)
- (2) Lion May Wong's successful election as a 3-Year Director of the Lions Nurses Scholarship Foundation Board (2013-2015)
- (3) Our Club's successful bid to host the N5 Convention in November 2014 at the Castle Hill RSL Club.

At the Bidding, Convention Bid Chair Lion Dr Danforn Lim and Deputy Bid Chair Lion Emily Hung gave a humorous and informative presentation and proclaimed what our Club could bring to the Lions District. The session ended with the enthusiastic exclamation by Sydney Chinese Lions members "Danforn, we are all behind you!" which drew a round of roaring applause from the crowd. This presentation helped raise the profile of Sydney Lions Chinese among the Conventioneers. We look forward to hosting the Convention in 2014. We are fully committed and determined to work really hard towards making the Convention a huge success.

Next year's N5 Convention will be held in Bathurst on 15-17 November 2013. It will be hosted by the Lions Club of Epping -Eastwood. It will surely be an exciting event and Sydney Chinese Lions are welcomed to join the Convention so that we can get a taste of the proceedings before we host our own in 2014.

Wealth Management Forum November 2012

A Financial Forum that is free and non-promotional just sounds too good to be true. But, it did happen on Saturday, 24 November, 2012. Sydney Chinese Lions organised this very successful Forum at which five high profile financial specialists interacted with some 100 members of the general public. At the conclusion of the Forum, nobody wanted to leave. The audience all congregated around the speakers asking questions and seeking more information. For those who attended, it was such a wonderful and educational experience.

"Unspoken Secret" was from Raymond, who is a business partner of RBS-Morgans. He explained how Investment Banks, Fund Managers and Stock Brokers operate and the risks when dealing with them. As he unveiled the reasons why Facebook's share value plummeted by 50% in less than six months after its IPO earned a loud round of applause from the audience.

Dr Wang is a Professor from the University of Technology and Science. His findings are most intriguing - in terms of long term return in the stock market: those with high IQ and good educational background have an advantage; single females perform better than males (excluding P.R.C.); individual buyers cannot win over finance companies or Foreign Funds. I was so glad that I always hold that opportunism does not pay - so individuals like myself do need to think twice before taking a plunge into the stock market.

Cindy is a CPA from Tax Master. She touched on many topics regarding taxation and negative gearing. Most members of the audience own investment properties or are planning to



purchase some more. Cindy was made to work extra hard as there were numerous questions from the audience in her FAQ segment. She also stressed that it is important to keep an eye on any possible changes in negative gearing policies imposed by the government.

Steven Yu is the Managing Director of Sunstar Capital/Longton Properties and an experienced lawyer. He focused on a major topic: Sino-Australia Cross-Border Investments. To our delight, he presented in a most interesting and easy-to-understand manner. Thanks to Australia's stable economy, its friendly multicultural environment, its well established and legal system, Australia continues to attract Chinese investors. Steven shared with the audience a couple of Mining and Property Development cases. He gave suggestions on how to avoid misleading input as well as demonstrated ways to minimise risk and maximise return.

Financial Planner Diana works for AMP. She identified common errors in personal wealth management: some people do not have a

good knowledge of their personal assets, others have poor journal or budgeting while some others neglect long term planning. Diana suggested that the last thing you want to do is when you see others have a promising return and follow suit without considering your personal financial circumstances.

The highlight of the Forum were the Panel Discussions. The five speakers sat down together with MC Duncan and Elaine on the stage, sharing their points of view on the stock and trade markets, funds and personal assets management, tax and legal matters as well as the Australian economy. At the conclusion of the Forum, as stated above, the speakers were surrounded by the audience who swamped them with questions.

I am so grateful that Sydney Chinese Lions has organised such an impressive educational event for the public. The Lions' motto is "We serve". My tribute to these dedicated Lions is, "Go Lions go! The fragrance always stays in the hand that gives the rose."
